
A BRJDGE TO THE FUTURE


III. BOOK: REFUGEE WORKERS IN THE INDOCHINA EXODUS, 1975-1982.



The fall of Vietnam, Cambodia and Laos to communist armies in 1975 caused a massive outpouring of refugees from these nations. This work focuses on the refugee crisis and the American aid workers--a colorful crew of malcontents and mavericks drawn from the State Department, military, USAID, CIA, and the Peace Corps--who took on the task of helping those most impacted by the Vietnam War.

Experts in Southeast Asia, its languages, cultures and people, they saved hundreds of thousands of lives. They were the very antithesis of the "Ugly American."




VI. DOCUMENTARY: A NECESSARY JOURNEY
