

II. New Book



Involved in Vietnam as a young army officer, a CIA case officer, the official responsible for counterinsurgency in our economic aid mission (USOM/Saigon) and as a State Department Consultant, author Rufus Phillips presents in this memoir and history an inside view of what happened during the critical 1954-1968 period. The author describes in vivid narration not only what happened on the American side but key events and personalities on the South Vietnamese side including the lead up to the November 1963 coup against President Diem. Having participated in the birth of an independent South Vietnam from 1954 to 1956, working under Colonel (later General) Edward G. Lansdale, Phillips earned the friendship and trust of many Vietnamese including President Diem, Generals Duong Van Minh and Le Van Kim, as well as members of Diem's political opposition. He had personal contact with President

Kennedy, Ambassadors Nolting and Lodge and Secretary Robert McNamara and was an advisor to Vice-President Hubert Humphrey. Phillips tried to introduce an understanding of Vietnamese politics to American leaders. He describes key events in his struggle to change the way the war was being fought and support was given to the Vietnamese in a struggle which ultimately only they could win.
