Tini Tran is a veteran foreign correspondent with The Associated Press. She has recently completed a year as a Nieman Fellow at Harvard University. Prior to that, she

served as the Vietnam bureau chief for The Associated Press, based in Hanoi from 1999-2006. Tini was the first Vietnamese-American allowed to join the permanent foreign press corps in post-war Vietnam and has traveled extensively throughout Asia and parts of the Middle East on assignment, reporting from Pakistan, Afghanistan and Iraq, among other countries.
